Clearance of Pavement along Dorking Road

We are delighted to report that the pavement on Dorking Road, between Lockner Farm and Roseacre Gardens, has at last been cleared. This has taken far longer than hoped but a very thorough job has now been done to restore the pavement back to its full width. It required a tractor, digger, and lorry with mechanised grabber to pick up and remove the huge piles of detritus. Thank you to all those that made this possible, including Surrey County Councillor Bob Hughes who allocated funding for this work, and the countryside contract team who carried it out. This is an excellent result as it now makes it much less hazardous for pedestrians. The Parish Council will be re-visiting the question of how best to keep this area clear in the future, as well as all the other pathways and footpaths in the parish.

Newly Planted Trees

Many thanks to those who have been helping us look after our newly planted trees during what has been a very challenging summer due to long periods without rain. We can report that those new trees planted by the Parish Council to mark the Queen's Platinum Jubilee, and trees given by Surrey County Council's Tree Planting Treescape Project, have all so far come through successfully.

Some of the new trees were planted at the **War Memorial Site.** The site is owned by the Parish Council and maintained to a high standard by an excellent local gardener. Each November a well-attended Service of Remembrance is held around the War Memorial, this year at 3 p.m. on Sunday 13th November.
